

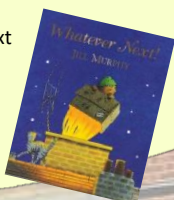
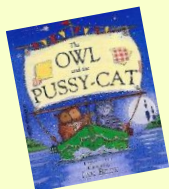
ENGLISH

As artists and musicians, we are learning to:

- explore musical dimensions using our voice and instruments e.g: high and low, short and long, fast and slow
- follow music signals and discover rhythm through games.
- continue to develop Art skills, recognising and designing using different media and patterns.
